I found out that Raymond and I have at least one thing in common and that is the love of good old-fashioned cooked meals. Raymond is originally from the southern United States and knows what good comfort food is. I am looking forward to eating some of his home cooking.

<u>Jeremiah</u> – We had the honor of celebrating Jeremiah's graduation from the Matthew 25 House. He fulfilled his twelve-month commitment and left the house well prepared for the next stage of his life. Shortly before he left he was able to get a job with John Deere as a machinist. He had gone to school for this occupation and was overjoyed to finally get the opportunity to use his education. I visited with Jeremiah this week and asked for an update as to what was happening in his life. He told me he had received his four-year sobriety pin from AA, he will get off of parole this month, and he has been able to spend quality time with his two boys, and he is enjoying his apartment and his new life.

As happens on occasion we have had a couple of residents make life decisions that required them to move out of the Matthew 25 House. Some who have left under these conditions are doing fine and others are not doing

well. I am always amazed and saddened at how quickly a person can self-destruct when he places himself in compromising situations.
